Graffiti Walk Question Guide

Station 1 – First Messages

Question:

What are some common assumptions people hear growing up about different groups of people?

Guiding prompts:

- Think about things you've heard adults say.
- Think about things that get repeated often.
- What kinds of assumptions are passed down casually?

Station 2 – Media and Representation

Question:

What kinds of stereotypes do we see in movies, TV, or social media?

Guiding prompts:

- How are certain groups often portrayed?
- Who is usually shown as the hero? The villain?
- What traits get exaggerated?

Station 3 – School and Peers

Question:

What assumptions do students sometimes make about each other?

Guiding prompts:

- Based on appearance?
- Based on interests?
- Based on academic ability?
- Based on where someone is from?

Station 4 — History & Society

Question:

What stereotypes have existed historically about certain groups?

Guiding prompts:

- What ideas have been repeated over time?
- How might those ideas have justified unfair treatment?
- Why do some stereotypes last for generations?

Station 5 — Language

Question:

What phrases or jokes have you heard that reinforce stereotypes?

Guiding prompts:

- “You people...” statements
- “All ___ are...” statements
- Comments that seem small but carry big assumptions
